PSC 100 Selected Topic: Political Science (1-6 Credits)

Maxwell

Exploration of a topic (to be determined) not covered by the standard curriculum but of interest to faculty and students in a particular semester. Repeatable

PSC 121 American National Government and Politics (3 Credits)

Maxwell

American political institutions. Basic principles embedded in structure and practices of American government. Practical consequences of this political system for the citizen. Credit is given for PSC 121 or PSC 129, but not both.

PSC 122 American State and Local Government and Politics (3 Credits)

Maxwell

Role of state and local politics in American politics. Changing notions of proper political process and governance. Nature of the political process. State and local interactions. Politics and policy pursuance.

PSC 123 Comparative Government and Politics (3 Credits)

Maxwell

Comparison of selected governmental institutions, individual and collective political actors, and issues across the industrialized and developing world. Particular attention to dynamics of socioeconomic and political change.

PSC 124 International Relations (3 Credits)

Maxwell

Foreign policy, decision making, comparative foreign policy, international transactions, and the international system. Credit is given for PSC 124 or PSC 139, but not both.

PSC 125 Political Theory (3 Credits)

Maxwell

Cross-listed with PHI 125

Introduction to theories of major modern political philosophers (Locke, Rousseau, Hume, J.S. Mill, Marx). Contemporary theories of liberty, justice, and equality.

PSC 129 American National Government and Politics (Honors) (3 Credits)

Maxwell

American political institutions and their founding. The public role in a democratic regime. Ability of contemporary arrangements to meet the demands of the modern world. Credit is given for PSC 121 or PSC 129, but not both.

PSC 139 International Relations (Honors) (3 Credits)

Maxwell

Major world views which comprise contemporary international relations. Lectures, readings, journal writing, and small group discussion. Credit is given for PSC 124 or PSC 139, but not both.

PSC 141 Liberty and Power from the Ancient World to Modernity (3 Credits)

Maxwell

Overview of those historical, social and political processes that have led to the birth of the modern world. Offered only in Florence for Discovery Florence students.

Maxwell

SUAbroad works with the SU academic department to assign the appropriate course level, title, and grade for the student's transcript.

Repeatable 2 times for 12 credits maximum

PSC 200 Selected Topics (1-6 Credits)

Maxwell

Exploration of a topic (to be determined) not covered by the standard curriculum but of interest to faculty and students in a particular semester. Repeatable

PSC 202 Introduction to Political Analysis (3 Credits)

Maxwell

Introduction to important political science concepts; basics of political argumentation and reasoning; and basic quantitative research and analysis techniques.

PSC 213 Comparative Government: Western Europe (3 Credits)

Maxwell

PSC 215 The Politics of Income Inequality (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

In this course, we are concerned with addressing two overarching questions: one, how has the rising level of income inequality influenced the practice of American democracy? And second, how has American politics contributed to the rise of income inequality?

PSC 231 Canadian Politics (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

An introduction to Canadian politics with a comparative perspective, this course covers core features of national government (parliament, courts, federalism) plus distinctive aspects such as Quebec nationalism, multiculturalism and indigenous rights.

PSC 270 Experience Credit (1-6 Credits)*Maxwell*

Participation in a discipline- or subject-related experience. Students must be evaluated by written or oral reports or an examination. Limited to those in good academic standing.

PSC 280 International Course (1-6 Credits)*Maxwell*

Offered through SUAbroad by educational institution outside the United States. Student registers for the course at the foreign institution and is graded according to that institution's practice. SUAbroad works with the S.U. academic department to assign the appropriate course level, title, and grade for the student's transcript.

Repeatable

PSC 290 Independent Study (1-6 Credits)*Maxwell*

In-depth exploration of a problem or problems. Individual independent study upon a plan submitted by the student. Admission by consent of supervising instructor or instructors and the department.

Repeatable

PSC 300 Selected Topics (1-6 Credits)*Maxwell*

Exploration of a topic (to be determined) not covered by the standard curriculum but of interest to faculty and students in a particular semester.

Repeatable

PSC 301 Introduction to Original Research (3 Credits)*Arts & Sciences, Maxwell*

Students learn how to design and conduct original research, including formulating questions, developing hypotheses, and choosing strategies for data collection. Sequences well with courses focused on data analysis.

PSC 302 Environmental Politics and Policy (3 Credits)*Arts & Sciences, Maxwell*

The environmental policy process and the politics that influence the formulation and adoption of environmental policies in the United States.

PSC 303 The Development of the American State (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

The size and scope of the national government has been a central organizing principle of political conflict throughout American history. This course explores the American state's changing relationship to society and economy over time.

PSC 304 The Judicial Process (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

American legal structure and process: policy making by courts, relations with other branches of the national government, and the changing role of the Supreme Court in our federal political system.

PSC 305 U.S. Congressional Politics (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Functions of the legislative branch: representation, control of the public purse, and executive oversight. Recent changes brought about by electoral forces and internal reforms.

PSC 306 African American Politics (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with AAS 306

Introduction to the African American experience in the American political system, from the colonial period to the present. Organization/leadership, federal institutions/relations, sociopolitical movements, and electoral politics.

PSC 307 The Politics of Citizenship (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

How governments understand membership through citizenship laws and practices. Includes the history of citizenship, evolution of modern citizenship, migration, and "post-national" citizenship.

PSC 308 The Politics of U.S. Public Policy (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Relationship between American political institutions, politics and public policy. Significance of public policies for democratization in the U.S., highlighting dynamics of race, class, and gender. Development and implementation of policies.

PSC 309 Interest Group Politics (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Uses theoretical and real world materials to examine the strengths and weaknesses of interest groups in American politics. The role of groups in shaping public interest and influencing policy decisions.

PSC 310 Refugees in International Politics (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Surveys global politics of refugees and those displaced by persecution, conflict, disasters, or development. Topics include historical trends, legal regimes, and ethical concerns. Explores causes and consequences of forced displacement, and responses by state and non-state actors.

PSC 311 American Political Parties (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Historical and contemporary roles of political parties in American government and politics.

PSC 312 e New Deal and American Politics (3 Credits)*Arts & Sciences, Maxwell*

The New Deal transformed American politics. This course examines the era from a range of perspectives, including economic conditions, the international context, the role of labor, the influence of southern legislators, and the Second World War. We will also examine how it set into motion shifts in party politics that would define the remainder of the twentieth century.

PSC 313 Campaign Analysis (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

In-depth analysis of specific campaigns. Review of literature, followed by analysis, involving: media review, targeting analyses, survey writing, polling, survey analysis, exit polling, and review of election results.

PSC 314 Public Opinion and Electoral Behavior (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

American mass public; origins, nature, effects of its political beliefs, and patterns of its voting behavior.

PSC 315 Politics and Media (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Sometimes called the 'fourth branch' of government, the media are an integral part of the political landscape. This course explores the role of the media in the operation of government and in the conduct of politics. PSC 316 The Supreme Court in American Politics (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

The Court's dual character as a legal and political institution. Explores the Court's decision-making process and the impact of those decisions on politics and policy.

PSC 317 Local Internship (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Students work in conjunction with members of Congress, state legislature, or in local political campaigns. Representatives of these offices come to seminars for discussions about working in government and politics.

PSC 318 Technology, Politics, and Environment (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Advanced technology as a focal point of governmental and political conflict in the United States and other nations. Interplay of technology and politics as a struggle over who will control the future and for what ends.

Cross-listed with WGS 319

Relationships between gender and American political institutions, law, and policymaking processes. How social movements based on gender, prevailing gender ideologies, and gender relations have shaped American politics. Exploring how the American state has shaped the political meanings and relative positions of power associated with men and women.

PSC 320 Comparative Law and Courts (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Aims to familiarize students with major legal traditions of the world.

Among the legal systems to be covered are the Common Law, Civil Law, Islamic Law, and African and Asian legal traditions.

Populist movements and roots of conspiracy culture in American politics. Populist ideology centered around suspicion of a manipulative power elite is a recurrent theme in American political discourse of both left and right.

PSC 322 International Security (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Introduction to the field of security studies within the discipline of Political Science. Case studies with a special focus on the U.S. role in fostering international security, and contemporary dilemmas for U.S. national security.

PSC 324 Constitutional Law I (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Introduction to American constitutional interpretation. Historical survey of basic Supreme Court doctrines focusing on the first 150 years of judicial action. The Court's role as a political institution.

PSC 325 Constitutional Law II (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Contemporary constitutional interpretation, focusing on the Bill of Rights and the fourteenth amendment. Issues of race, gender, privacy, property, free speech, religious diversity, and political representation.

PSC 326 Foundations of American Political Thought (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with HST 383

American political thought from the Puritans to Lincoln. American Revolution, establishment of the Constitution, and Jeffersonian and Hamiltonian systems.

PSC 327 Modern American Political Thought (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with HST 342

American political thought from the impact of Darwinian science to the present. Basic thought patterns of 20th-century public life and philosophical foundations of contemporary political movements.

PSC 328 American Social Movements (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Social movements were always integral to American politics. Includes emergence, strategies, political context and influence of temperance, abolition of slavery, women's suffrage, labor, civil rights, anti-war, feminism, nuclear freeze, gay rights, and global justice movements.

Evolution, operation, and perceptions of the American presidency during the last quarter-century. Modern chief executives and factors contributing to their success or failure.

PSC 330 Political Economy of Gender in Industrialized Countries (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Asks why men and women are treated differently within the family, at work, and in politics by examining the relative importance of societal norms, religion, public policy and individual economic decisions.

PSC 333 Politics of Latin America (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with LAS 333

Political processes and institutions in Latin America. The region's experience with modernization.

Cross-listed with LAS 335

The history and politics of Mexico, with special attention to relations between Mexico and the United States and the politics of immigration, NAFTA, the drug trade, and other bilateral issues.

PSC 335 Politics of East Asia (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Domestic and international politics of East Asia broadly defined. Political development and structure of major countries: Japan, Korea, and China. Politics of public policy, international, and transnational relations in the region.

PSC 336 Money and Politics (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

This course looks at political science research on money and politics in different countries around the world. How much money is there in politics, what influence does it have, should we try to reduce it, and if so, how?

PSC 337 Politics and Economy of Japan (3 Credits)*Arts & Sciences, Maxwell*

This course is about Japan's economy, politics and society. It focuses on: (i) Japan's extreme demographic aging its origins and current & future problems; and (ii) changing geopolitics in East Asia.

PSC 338 Race, Ethnicity, and American Politics (3 Credits)*Arts & Sciences, Maxwell*

This course examines race and ethnicity in American politics, with particular attention to African Americans, Latinos, and Asian Americans as voters, activists, and policymakers. Among other topics, we will examine public opinion, trends in partisanship and voting behavior, the link between traditional civil rights organizations and new social movements, debates about pan-ethnicity, descriptive and substantive representation in political institutions, and intersectionality.

PSC 339 Transitions to Democracy (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

The underlying forces and processes of political regime change and transitions to democracy in the modern world.

PSC 341 Politics of Africa (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with AAS 341

Historical foundations of the move towards political freedom, democracy and self rule in Africa. Dynamics of the political process.

PSC 342 Religion and Politics in the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with MES 342, REL 342, JSP 342

Considers the extent to which religion matters in an enduring ethno-nationalist conflict. Approaches the Israeli-Palestinian conflict from an interdisciplinary perspective that explores the intersection of religion and politics.

PSC 343 Politics of Europe (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

The politics of Western and Eastern Europe. Domestic political and political economic institutions and the process of European integration.

PSC 344 Politics of the Middle East (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with MES 344

Religious, political, economic, and social dimensions of life in modern Middle East. Legacy of Islam, encounter with Western modernity, Arab-Israeli conflict, and political economy of the region.

PSC 345 Capitalism, For and Against (3 Credits)*Arts & Sciences, Maxwell*

This course examines the moral, social, political, and economic effects of capitalism through a study of some of the seminal philosophical discussions of commerce, private property, and economic inequality. Authors may include Rousseau, Smith, Marx, Hayek, Rawls, and Nozick. PSC 346 Comparative Third World Politics (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with AAS 346

Examines thematically and comparatively the political systems of South America, Asia, and Africa, exploring topics such as colonization, decolonization, nation-building, the postcolonial state and its institutions, the recent wave of democratization, and the challenges of socioeconomic development.

PSC 347 Politics of Russia (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Politics of Russia and the former Soviet Union. Political institutions, and political, economic, and social change, particularly since 1991.

The military's role in the modern state and in modern society. Broad geographic coverage, including the United States, Europe, Latin America, Africa, the Middle East, and Asia.

PSC 349 Politics of Iran (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with MES 349

Historical and theoretical understanding of modern Iranian politics and society from the late 19th century to the present time.

PSC 350 Problems in International Relations (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Selected problems and issues. Specific topics chosen by the instructor. Repeatable

PSC 351 Political Economy of Development (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

The interrelationship of political, social, and economic factors that produce development outcomes. The role of the state in markets and the relationship between democracy and development.

PSC 352 International Law (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Fundamental principles and recognized rules that make up international law concerning conduct of nations. Protection of nationals abroad, jurisdiction in territorial waters and on high seas, rights and duties of diplomats and consuls, and the law of treaties.

PSC 353 International Organization (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Causes and consequences of collective actions taken by state, intergovernmental, and transnational nongovernmental individual and collective actors. May include global and regional level issues of (human) security, economic and social development, environmental protection, and resource management.

The role of ethical concerns, imperatives, and restraints in international relations. Includes realism, just war theory, the ethics of nuclear deterrence, and other topics at the discretion of the instructor.

PSC 373 Political Philosophy: The Social Contract Tradition and its Critics (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with PHI 317

Political obligation in the writings of the three major social contract theorists, Hobbes, Locke, and Rousseau. Additional reading from their critics such as Burke, Mill, and Marx.

As such, we will understand that Black Feminism is global and diasporic. We will begin with a survey and broad analysis of Black Feminist history and origins.

PSC 385 Classical Political Philosophy (3 Credits)*Arts & Sciences, Maxwell*

Cross-listed with PHI 305

Exploration of the enduring questions of ancient political philosophy: questions about justice, the best regime, and the best way of life; through a study of Plato's dialogues, Aristotle's Politics, and Machiavelli's The Prince.

PSC 386 Gender, Militarism, and War (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with WGS 354, SOC 354

Examines militarism and war and their relationship to gender and power. Particular attention is given to how war impacts people differently across axes of race, class, ethnicity, sexuality, and other forms of identity. University Requirement Course: IDEA Requirement Eligible

PSC 391 Revolutions in the Middle East (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with MES 391

A comparative study of revolutions in the Middle East in terms of causes, processes and outcomes.

PSC 392 Islamism and Islamist Movements Today (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Please note that PSC 396 and PSC 405 cannot both be taken for credit.

PSC 397 Realism and Power Politics in International Relations (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

PSC 398 How the United States Became a Great Power (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Between 1785 and 1900, the USA grew into a great power. This course investigates the foreign relations of the USA during this period. Which international relation theories best explain America's relationship with the European great powers?

PSC 400 Selected Topics (1-6 Credits)*Maxwell*

Exploration of a topic (to be determined) not covered by the standard curriculum but of interest to faculty and students in a particular semester. Repeatable

PSC 404 Strategic Choice and Politics (3 Credits)*Arts & Sciences, Maxwell*

This course introduces the student to game theory and its application in political science, economics, and business.

PSC 405 Politics of the European Union (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Politics of European integration from a variety of perspectives: theoretical, historical, institutional, and policy-making. Fundamental post-war political process in modern-day Europe. Offered only through SU Abroad. Students cannot get credit for both PSC 396 and PSC 405. Shared Competencies: Critical and Creative Thinking (<https://coursecatalog.syracuse.edu/shared-competencies/critical-and-creative-thinking/>)

PSC 406 Citizenship from Modernity to Globalization (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with PHI 406

Offered only in Florence. Citizenship as a major crossroads in European political thought: key thinkers; permutations throughout European history; impact of globalization and European unification on concepts of citizenship, liberty, and justice.

PSC 407 Designing Surveys and Experiments (3 Credits)*Maxwell, Arts & Sciences*

PSC 408 Politics of Immigration in Europe (3 Credits)*Maxwell, Arts & Sciences*

Cross-listed with SOS 408

Offered regularly through Syracuse Abroad. Analyze immigration policy in the European Union and its individual member states with attention to its residual socioeconomic and political implications. Special focus on gender, ethnic, and religious identities as they relate to immigration policy.

PSC 410 Political Mapping (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

This course focuses on how geography affects politics. We will discuss cases across American Politics and Comparative Politics, and will use the QGIS mapping software to create maps and visualize political and spatial data.

PSC 411 Senior Seminars (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Integrates student coursework by providing in-depth analysis of a particular topic. Recommended seminar choice is one in a subfield of the discipline in which the student has some prior preparation.

PSC 412 Global Governance: The United Nations System (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with IRP 412

The theory and practice of global governance and international diplomacy through an in-depth study of the United Nations system. Critique readings and discuss current UN-related events. Fulfills the IR capstone for International Law and Organizations (ILO). Permission of instructor.

Prereq: PSC 124 or 139

PSC 414 European Identity: Shifting Borders (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with IRP 314, HST 471

Offered regularly through Syracuse Abroad. Seminar including field study in multiple Central Europe locations. Examines how borders and identities have shifted over time, and the role of these shifts on the current rise of populism in the region.

Repeatable 2 times for 4 credits maximum

PSC 415 European Identity: Multicultural Europe (3 Credits)*Maxwell, Arts & Sciences*

Cross-listed with IRP 315

Seminar including field study in multiple Western Europe locations. Examine how the national identities of these countries, and of Western Europe as a whole, are being transformed through immigration and the ideology of multiculturalism.

PSC 420 The East Asian Century? Opportunities and Challenges for the Region & the US (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with HST 420, IRP 320

Double-numbered with PSC 620, HST 620

Examines the trajectories of and interactions between China, Japan, and Korea, with a focus on the implications of these developments for the region and the United States.

PSC 421 Contemporary Central and Eastern Europe (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with HST 411

Offered only in Strasbourg. This course is designed to help students grasp the overall nature of contemporary Eastern and Central Europe, with emphasis on the breakup of the Soviet Union, and challenges of democratization and of EU unification.

PSC 422 Modern Spain: History and Politics (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with HST 412

Offered only in Madrid. Starting with an analysis of current political, social, economic, and cultural issues in Spain, students define problems and questions, then review Spanish history to find the roots of those problems.

Offered only in Santiago. The time period (1940-present) and its significance and contributions to the configuration of social, political and economic aspects of Chile today. Relies on primary sources, comparisons within the Southern Cone, and a focus on US role and influence during this period.

PSC 426 Religion and Diversity in London (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Using the city's unparalleled networks of diverse religious and faith communities, architecture and infrastructure, this class will explore the contrast between religious animosity and coexistence.

PSC 427 Policy Seminar/Contemporary Europe (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

PSC 428 Contemporary Issues in Chile and Latin America (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with IRP 334, LAS 334, HST 406, SPA 334

Offered only in Santiago. This seminar features in-situ lectures and activities in Chile, Argentina and Uruguay introducing important political, sociological and environmental issues in the Southern Cone region.

PSC 429 European Human Rights (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Through comparative study in six countries and their urban centers, students will explore some of the most rapidly changing regions in Europe with attention paid to issues of identity, memory and history of Central Europe. Offered only through Syracuse Abroad.

PSC 435 Humanitarian Action in World Politics (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

This course deals with the global politics of humanitarianism. Topics covered include the historical evolution of humanitarian norms and principles, key actors in the humanitarian sector, and institutional frameworks governing humanitarian action. We also explore the challenges associated with emergency relief, development aid, and military intervention.

PSC 442 Democratization in East Asia (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Offered only in Hong Kong. Examines the efforts at democratization in East Asia, including such early efforts as the May Fourth Movement in China (1920s-1930s) and the Taisho Democracy in Japan (1920s). Comparisons are made with current situations in Taiwan, Hong Kong and South Korea.

PSC 444 Culture, Business and Political Economics in East Asia (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

PSC 445 Contemporary British Politics and the Modern World (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with HST 445

Offered only in London. British political system and the historical factors shaping it, as well as Britain's role in creating the modern world and its place in the world today.

PSC 450 Undergraduate Research Program (1-4 Credits)*Maxwell*

Repeatable

PSC 451 Italian Politics: Laboratory of Populism (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Offered only in Florence. Identify elements and characteristics of different kinds of populist movements, with a special focus on Italy. Examine how such movements impact both the national and international political context and the potential risks they pose to democracies.

PSC 458 Contemporary Issues in Turkey (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with IRP 458, SOC 458

Double-numbered with PAI 658

Offered only in Istanbul. Key political and social issues in contemporary Turkey. Democratization; relationship between secularism, the role of the military and Islam in political life; foreign policy including Turkish-US relations; nationalism, minorities, gender, human rights. Additional work required of graduate students.

PSC 462 Globalization Development and Environment (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Cross-listed with ECN 362

Offered only in London. Differing perspectives on changing global economy and nature of modern state. Key ideas regarding development through experiences of developing countries in Asia and Africa.

Concepts of Irish and British national identities; religious conflict and peace-making attempts within Ireland; new tensions wrought by international migration and regional politics.

This course offers an inside look into the domestic politics and foreign policy ambitions brewing inside a fragile but increasingly assertive China. PSC 481 East Central Europe in the 20th Century (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Examine twentieth-century history of East and Central Europe by focusing on key socio-political phenomena of nationalism, dictatorship, and civil society. Look at political and social history through the lens of arts, literature and film.

PSC 489 Readings in Political Science (Honors) (1-6 Credits)*Maxwell*

Directed tutorial-type program of readings in selected aspects of political science.

PSC 490 Independent Study (1-6 Credits)*Maxwell*

In-depth exploration of a problem or problems. Individual independent study upon a plan submitted by the student. Admission by consent of supervising instructor or instructors and the department.

PSC 495 Distinction Thesis Seminar in Political Science I (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Individual research work in conjunction with seminar participation guided by faculty seminar instructor and individual mentors. Defining thesis projects. Senior political science students only. PSC 496 Distinction Thesis Seminar in Political Science II (3 Credits)*Maxwell*

Participation in a discipline or subject related experience. Student must be evaluated by written or oral reports or an examination. Permission in advance with the consent of the department chairperson, instructor, and dean. Limited to those in good academic standing.

Exploration of a problem, or problems, in depth. Individual independent study upon a plan submitted by the student. Admission by consent of supervising instructor(s) and the department.
